



In a jointly-supported funding opportunity, the **Center for Demography & Ecology** and the **Collaborative for Reproductive Equity** invite applications for a **quick-turnaround, small grant competition** supporting research on the implications of reductions in reproductive health care access in the US. Average grant size: \$5,000.

Submission Deadline: September 9, 2022

Award Notification: October 10, 2022

Purpose

The competition is designed to support:

- (a) research for high-impact, policy-relevant scientific publications
- (b) researchers' time and ability to write and submit grant applications to external funders

Research Focus

Proposals on a wide range of topics related to the implications of changes to reproductive health care access. Of particular interest is research that addresses the implications of changes in access to abortion, abortifacients, or contraceptive access on:

Parental, child, and infant health and wellbeing, including morbidity and mortality in pregnancy
Adolescent health and wellbeing
Black, Latina, and Indigenous health and wellbeing
LGBTQ+ health and wellbeing
Economic welfare and economic inequality
Interaction with the criminal justice system
Population processes, including fertility, mortality, migration, and marriage

Eligibility

All UW-Madison affiliates (faculty, scientist, researcher) with permanent Principal Investigator (PI) status at their institution are invited to apply. Grants can be single- or multi-investigator.

Budget

Grants can be used for a range of purposes, including data collection, data purchasing, hourly research support, or researcher time/salary for applicants developing and submitting external grant applications.

Number of Awards

The number of awards will be based on the number and size of the requests. We expect to fund 4-6 awards.

Application Process: By **September 9**, please submit a 2-page application to [this link](#) that contains:

1. Aims and Significance: What research question are you asking, and why is it important?
2. Approach: What data/methods will you use?
3. Expected Products and Outcomes, including plans for grant submission (funder, deadline) if relevant
4. Statement about IRB – note that funding **cannot be released** without IRB approval
